


Figure 1. Plan for improvements planned for Spring Street from Victor Gruen's Patterns for Progress




Figure 2. Plan for traffic circulation from Victor Gruen's Patterns for Progress




Figure 3. Downtown area with topographic overlay from Victor Gruen's Patterns for Progress




Figure 4. Portland Neighborhood PDF Map from PortlandMaine.Gov Public Map Gallery. Spring Street – Free Street is central to Downtown and links East and West End.




Figure 6. FEMA Flood Map from PortlandMaine.Gov Public Map Gallery. Depicting use of roads as well as FEMA flood area.




Figure 7. Pedestrian Activities District Overlay Zone Map from PortlandMaine.Gov Public Map Gallery.




Figure 5. Nodes recommended for improvement. Figure V-2 of The Downtown Portland Traffic & Streetscape Study (1999).




Figure 8. Lobsterman's Plaza diagram of space. A list of recommendations for spaces and corridors on page V-6 of the Downtown Portland Traffic and Streetscape Study.

Wayfinding System Study (2008)

The study objectives were to evaluate pedestrian and vehicular use in Portland and make recommendations for streetscape features.

- The Lobsterman's Plaza evaluated again in this study as it was in the Traffic and Streetscape Study (1999) nine years prior.
- A valuable resource for maps that explain the context of the Spring St – Free St area.




Figure 10. Area parking and pedestrian information pathways map (p.21).

Cobb, Architect for the Portland Museum of Art and former Chairman of the Department of Architecture at the Harvard Graduate School of Design, described Portland as,








Image 3, Wayfinding Study, p. 21
