

Average Number of Families Served On Any Given Night – Per Month







Refugee: A person who has a well-founded fear of persecution if he/she should return to his/her home country.

Visa Holder: A visa allows a foreign citizen to travel to the U.S. port-of entry, and request permission of the U.S. immigration inspector to enter the United States.

Asylum Pending/Granted: A person who cannot return to his home country because of a well-founded fear of persecution must apply for asylum within 12 months of entry to the United States.

Lottery: The Department of State has an annual lottery for individuals from countries with low rates of immigration to the United States.
