

## Spring 2006 Bulky Waste Collection

**Eligibility:** Residents in buildings served by City of Portland trash collection crews may place acceptable items out for curbside bulky waste collection as directed by a published schedule

### Schedule:

District 1: May 15 – May 19

District 2: May 22 – May 26

District 3: May 30 – June 2

District 4: June 5 – June 9

District 5: June 12 – June 16

Residents wishing to participate may set out acceptable items no earlier than the weekend prior to the scheduled date. *Once collection crews have passed by an address they will not return to collect late set-outs.*

### Acceptable materials:

- Mattresses and box springs
- Furniture
- Refrigerators
- Air conditioners
- Stoves/ovens
- Large toys
- Washers/dryers
- Rolled carpets
- Hot water heaters
- Televisions/large musical equipment
- Computer monitors
- Cabinets
- Toilets, sinks, tubs
- Large metal products

### Unacceptable materials:

- Construction materials or debris
- Cardboard
- Brush
- Paper products
- Tree waste
- Household trash
- Liquid waste
- Hazardous waste
- Items in plastic bags
- Clothes and textiles
- Propane tanks
- Tires
- Other items deemed inappropriate by the Director of Public Works or designee

*Unacceptable items and material set out improperly during curbside collection will not be collected and must be removed and properly disposed of by the property owner.*

**Preparation:** Items placed out during a scheduled curbside collection must be sorted into the following categories: wood, metal, TVs and Computer Monitors and miscellaneous. *Crews will not collect items unless they are properly sorted. Doors should be removed from any appliances such as refrigerators and freezers.*

**Quantity allowed:** During a designated period of curbside collection residents in each eligible housing unit may place out up to six (6) items from the list of acceptable materials
