**ORDER REFERRING  
AN ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE AND REPORTING PLAN  
TO THE SUSTAINABILITY AND TRANSPORTATION COMMITTEE**

**ORDERED,** that the City Council hereby refers an energy infrastructure and reporting plan, attached hereto, as proposed in connection with the Climate Action Plan, to the Sustainability and Transportation Committee; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDERED,** that the Sustainability and Committee review the proposed plan and provide its final recommendation on this issue to the City Council.

## ENERGY INFRASTRUCTURE AND REPORTING PLAN

- NEW INFRASTRUCTURE
  - A limit of 20,000 gallons per facility or project
  - No new pipelines, storage, or refineries
- EXPANSION
  - Existing facilities can be maintained and expand below the 20,000 gallon threshold
  - No increase in rail transportation of fossil fuels (frequency and size)
- REPORTING
  - Air quality near existing fossil fuel infrastructure in Portland
  - Existing and new transloading (size, frequency, exposure) of fossil fuels with the goal of understanding what's moving around the city for safety purposes
- EXCEPTIONS (following the Portland, OR ordinance)
  - improvements in the safety, efficiency, or operations of existing infrastructure;
  - the provision of service directly to end users;
  - development of emergency backup capacity under 20,000 gallons;
  - infrastructure that enables recovery or re-processing of used petroleum products;  
or
  - infrastructure that will accelerate the transition to non-fossil fuel energy sources
